PRESIDENT'S COLUMN

Our Friendship Force of the San Francisco Bay Area board met January 23^d to go over plans for the upcoming year. As reported elsewhere in the Newsletter most of the board members who served in 2010 have agreed to continue to serve, and I appreciate it that several new board members have stepped forward to serve also.

2011 looks like an exciting one for our club. In July, twenty-one ambassadors from Malang, Indonesia will arrive and stay with us for a week after visiting the Vancouver, Canada club. In October, the Dallas, Texas club will pay us a visit also. Our club traveled to Dallas and San Antonio in 2009. In May our international exchange will take 20 ambassadors to Biarritz, France for a home stay and to other cities in France and northern Spain.

On February 26th, we will have our annual World Friendship Day celebration at the First Methodist Church in Fremont. Our speaker, Sahar Ghazi, will discuss what is currently taking place in Pakistan, and a couple from Dresden, Germany will play a classical work by Chopin. If you feel like dressing up in an international costume that day, feel free to do so.

Later in August we are hoping to have a brief two or three day exchange with the Napa/Sonoma club. We are still making arrangements for that exchange, and more details will be forthcoming.

For those of you who might be interested in attending the Western Regional Leadership Conference that will be held in Bakersfield from March 25-27, contact Barry Rader. Finally, our Annual Meeting is scheduled for October 1, which will coincide with our Welcome Party for the Dallas club, and our Holiday Luncheon will be held at Michael's Shoreline Restaurant in Mountain View on December 10.
